Gary Wregglesworth was first elected to the Onaway City Commission in 1987, serving until 1989 when he resigned for personal and work commitment reasons. While this decision best served his family, he felt he had not yet fulfilled his commitment to those that elected him. In 1997, as the City began looking into the construction of a sanitary sewer system, Gary decided to again run for a seat on Onaway's governing body, believing such a system was vital if the community was to experience any growth or development.

Gary was elected in 1997 to a two-year seat on the commission. In 1999, he was elected mayor, believing that he might be voted out of office due to the difficulties involved with building the sewer system but also believing that doing so was too important to give up on. The sewer was completed in 2006, and Gary is presently is beginning his sixth three-year term as mayor.
